Working together to support boreal caribou recovery


Dear caribou colleagues,

The Canadian Conservation and Land Management (CCLM) Knowledge Network is a collaborative group of organizations committed to creating a forum for sharing information and lessons learned about boreal caribou conservation, wetland best practices, land restoration and land reclamation. Together, we've developed an accessible online platform, the CCLM Knowledge Portal (www.ccImportal.ca), to share resources and to connect practitioners across Canada.




Getting Involved with the CCLM

Site Structure

The CCLM Knowledge Portal consists of one main portal divided into three subportals: 1) Boreal Caribou, 2) Wetland Knowledge and 3) Land Management. This structure facilitates more streamlined management of the site because collaborators can contribute to and maintain the subportals relevant to their area of expertise.

The site was designed with custom-built search and filtering features, allowing users to search across and within each of the three subportals. Also, the Boreal Caribou Portal contains an interactive map that enables users to search caribou conservation projects by geographic location. Being able to see where conservation efforts are taking place and who is involved will help facilitate more coordinated conservation efforts and increased resource sharing. 


Connecting You to Knowledge Holders

Goals of the Boreal Caribou Interactive Map

The Boreal Caribou Interactive Map is a spatially explicit map of boreal caribou projects completed or underway across Canada. The goals of the map are to:

- Connect you to information on boreal caribou across Canada;
- Facilitate knowledge sharing and learning;
- Facilitate collaboration and knowledge generation;
- Support boreal caribou conservation and recovery.

Find Projects!

Use the filter options bar on the left hand side of the screen to search for projects that are of interest to you. You can search projects by:

- AREA
- KEYWORD
- INDIGENOUS INVOLVEMENT
- ID, NAME or DESCRIPTION

Find Collaborators!

Through the interactive map you can find people in your area working on topics that interest you. For example, search projects by the keyword 'RESTORATION' to discover who is working on habitat restoration projects in your area. Reach out to contacts to learn more about their work or form new collaborations!

Get Highlights!


