In this newsletter, you will receive updates on several initiatives undertaken by the NBCKC and it's associated groups.



Launched in April 2020, and now home to nearly 1000 resources, the website was designed to provide an accessible and centralized place to share conservation and land management resources from across Canada.

This fall, we will be entering our second phase of site development, with the aim of further enhancing and refining the many features and functionalities available on the CCLM Knowledge Portal. # **NBCKC Updates**

#### Indigenous Collaboration

Since the 2nd annual meeting, the IKC has worked to further refine its Terms of Reference and define priorities for the coming year. A Steering Committee of 7 members formed, was representing First Nation, Métis and Inuit communities spanning coast to coast to coast. The Steering Commitee met for the first time in October and will meet alternatively with the larger IKC network. Moving Forward with Collaborative Research and Monitoring for Boreal Caribou -Preliminary Analysis of Indigenous Initiatives and Initial Recommendations was completed in August. The associated database contains over 200 Indigenous-led and Indigenous-involved projects that will be uploaded over the coming months to the CCLM portal. The report will be made available once the IKC have reviewed it.

With support from ECCC, several Indigenous communities and organizations involved with the NBCKC are undertaking projects related to Traditional Knowledge studies, caribou monitoring, youth-elder on-the-land programs and chronic wasting disease monitoring programs. We look forward to hearing more about their work in the future!

#### Working Groups

On September 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Monitoring Working Group (MWG) held a meeting to review the feedback received over the summer on its monitoring methods toolkit. The Guidance Tools in the Part 2 'Best Practices' portion of the Boreal Caribou Monitoring Methods Toolkit are intended to aid the user in selecting a suitable monitoring program, based on their monitoring objectives. MWG members had the opportunity to vote on decisions to be made, by using a meeting survey form. The MWG continues to see progress in the development of these tools and plans to begin uploading resources to the CCLM as early as November!

The Habitat Restoration Working Group (HRWG) met on September 16<sup>th</sup> to discuss feedback received at the June NBCKC Meeting. A report on the development and use of the Boreal Caribou Conceptual *Ecological Model* will be prepared for Spring 2021. The HRWG discussed their next steps and future knowledge sharing topics of interest.

The core membership of the **Population Management Working Group (PMWG**), co-led by the Canadian Wildlife Service and the Alberta Biodiversity Monitoring Institute - Caribou Monitoring Unit convened its first meeting on September 17<sup>th</sup>. PMWG members are currently revising a Terms of Reference for this group and will begin holding regular meetings starting in November..
