

Spotlight

FORT NELSON FIRST NATION (FNFN), blazing the path for Indigenous-led caribou habitat restoration in Canada.

- In 2018, FNFN began trials to restore boreal caribou habitat within their traditional territory.
- Since 2019, FNFN has restored 263.38 km.
- STAY TUNED! FNFN is screening their restoration documentary '<u>The Medzih Story</u>: <u>Restoring a Caribou Landscape</u>' across western Canada in the coming months. <u>Event dates will</u> <u>be posted on the CCLM (Premieres Nov 10th!</u>).
- The NBCKC Secretariat thanks Katherine Wolfenden, FNFN Lands & Resources Manager, for generously sharing her wealth of experience and knowledge with our network over the years.

Here's what's happening in our network:

- Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) releases the '2020 Anthropogenic Disturbance Footprint within boreal caribou ranges across Canada'.
- West Moberly First Nations, Saulteau First Nations, the B.C. and federal governments significantly <u>expand Klinse-Za/Twin Sisters Park</u> to protect ~200,000 ha of caribou habitat.
- The Canadian Mountain Network has a new identity! Explore the new <u>Braiding Knowledges</u> Canada website today.
- The Centre for Indigenous Environmental Resources (CIER) shared a beautiful and informative presentation <u>'How did we get here?'</u> on the Southern Mountain Caribou Recovery Strategy amendment process underway.
- The Alberta Regional Caribou Knowledge Partnership (ARCKP) releases their <u>2023-2024</u> <u>Annual Report</u>.
